From the President's Desk



We are deeply saddened to have lost one of our BHS presidents, former Bristol City Historian, and hometown hero, Bob Montgomery. Bob's granddaughter, Ciara Licht, is following in his footsteps as a writer. She wrote a moving tribute to her grandfather, some of which is contained here in what follows. We wish to extend to her and to her family our deepest condolences.

Bob has always been dedicated to Bristol. He graduated from Bristol Eastern High School in 1963 as an impressive athlete. With his love of sports, he began writing about local sports in 1987. In 1997, he helped create the Bristol Sports Hall of Fame with John Fortunato and served as its first president. History was very important to Bob. When the city historian, Dorothy Manchester, passed away, Bob was crushed. He felt that it was important to still have Bristol's history live on through the columns of the Bristol Press, so he asked the editor of the paper if he could take on the role of Bristol historian. Because of some of those pieces, in 2016 the Korean War Veterans organization awarded hit their "Man of the Year Award. Then in 2017, the City of Bristol selected him for its "Hometown Hero" award.

Throughout his lifetime, Bob took on many volunteer positions, one of which was as the President of the Bristol Historical Society. He took pride in writing about the men and women who shaped and built our town. He loved informing Bristol's citizens about town events and spotlighting special individuals.

Bob Montgomery is Bristol and Bristol is and will always be Bob Montgomery. Bob, we will miss you, think of you often during historical events and will know you are at peace.

March – Women's History Month

On **Thursday, March 20** the first Third Thursday program for the year 2025 begins with a special program cosponsored by the Memorial Military Museum and the Bristol Historical Society.

In the fall of 2024, the Bristol Women in the Military Committee was established to honor Bristol's female veterans, a subject never documented or honored before in Bristol's history.

This committee, comprised of BHS, MMM members and others have been working hard researching countless families of those brave women who have shared their stories.

One story led to a wonderful surprise that will be shared on March 20, and that story is of Michelina Masterbone who was believed to be Bristol's last surviving WWII female veteran until her recent death. So mark your calendar because this is a program you won't want to miss.

This committee's goal is to preserve the stories for every woman who has served or is currently serving for future generations. If you have a female family member or know of someone serving or has served, please contact Carol Denehy (860-583-5466). The program is free, but monetary donations would be appreciated.

The fundraising committee will be meeting again in the near future to finalize next year's Bingo date(s) and theme. Did I hear the "Luck of the Irish"?


Be on the lookout for our annual tag sale to be held on May 30 and 31, at our Summer Street location and our first annual "Christmas in July" sale, July date TBD.

Memorial Military Museum 2005: Year of the Woman



With this year marking the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II, we will be honoring Bristol women who volunteered to serve in the US military during that era. In 1942, there was a dire shortage of men to serve in combat. For the first time in our history, in 1942, the government enacted laws to organize women's branches of service in the Navy, Army, Coast Guard and Marine corps. As stated in an Army manual: "Your Job is to Replace Men. Be Ready to Take Over." Meet the Bristol women who bravely accepted that challenge. As WAVES, WACS, SPARS, and US Marine Corps Women's reserve, they were trained in traditional male jobs and duties on military bases for "the duration (of the war) plus six months." How they performed those duties forever changed the role of military women to this day.



The Bristol Sports Hall of Fame is very sad to announce the passing of Bob Montgomery at the age of 79. Bob was co-founder of the HOF along with John Fortunato in 1997. Their vision and dedication to help preserve Bristol's rich sports history has endured for the past 27 years and has enabled the HOF to continue to grow and provide meaningful programs for both students and adults.

Bob was elected into the BSHOF "Class of 2014" and remained a director until his passing. Bob took over the role as City Historian a number of years ago and kept the history and more importantly the stories of Bristol and its people alive in his columns in the Bristol Press and recently in The Bristol Edition.

Bob knew many people and never had a bad word about anyone. He did many good deeds for others that most people didn't know and never sought recognition for it. He will be missed by all including his HOF family. May he RIP.



SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Do you know a college-bound Bristol senior with an interest in history? The Historical Society gives a scholarship each year of \$1500 to a Bristol resident heading to a two- or four-year college/university. Applicants are not required to have an interest in pursuing history in the future but must have a minimum of a 3.0 average for 7 semesters. Applicants will be asked to write an essay based on a historical topic in one of the Society's annual ornaments or a business represented in the Made in Bristol exhibit, with the exception of the Lake Compounce exhibit.
